## Hummingbirds' Migration Marathon

Could you finish a marathon race? How about 38 of them, a distance just under 1,000 miles?

Well, as crazy as it sounds, that's what some hummingbirds are doing right now.

The next couple of months are your best opportunity to see hummingbirds. Adult hummingbirds are now joined by a horde of juveniles as they head south to Central America and their winter territories, some traveling thousands of miles.

It's estimated that more than seven million Ruby-throated Hummingbirds return to the tropics each winter, along with six million Rufous, three million Broad-tailed, and millions of other individuals of various hummingbird species.

En route to their destination, hummingbirds will take part in an eating binge that is unmatched at any other time of the year. A high-calorie diet is important to build fat reserves for their migratory trip. So be sure to have your hummingbird feeders filled with a nectar solution.

Bird banding studies indicate that, with very few exceptions, the hummingbirds visiting your feeders on a late-migration day are completely replaced by a new wave of migrants within 24 hours.

To estimate the number of hummingbirds using your feeders during migration, multiply times five. For example, if you see 10 hummingbirds at your feeder at one time, you will have about 50 passing through your yard that day.

### Improve the View

- Get a closer view of hummingbirds with our Decorative Window Hummingbird Feeder, or bring your existing hummingbird feeders closer to your window with an Advanced Pole System® or hummingbird pole.
- Get clearer views of ALL the visiting hummingbirds with any WBU Hummingbird Feeder. Our tray-style feeders don't block the view (gravity-fed bottle feeders block views).
- Our High Perch™ Hummingbird Feeder features a high perch that allows hummingbirds to comfortably rest. Longer perching/sitting times at the feeder provide better, longer views of the birds.

### Multiple Feeders: Ban the Bully!

- Hummingbirds, particularly adult males, can be very feisty and aggressive when defending their territories. Multiple feeders, spread throughout your yard, will encourage more hummingbirds to visit and keep bullies at bay.
- The more feeders you offer and the more spread out they are, the more difficult it is for a protective hummingbird to defend all the feeders. Others, like females or even juveniles, will be able to eat more often, perhaps staying longer to feed or rest at feeders.

### Take a Closer Look

- Watch hummingbirds' tongues as they move in and out of the mouth (up to 12 times per second) to lap up nectar.
- Catch a glimpse of their tiny feet. Hummingbirds have very small feet that are primarily used for preening and perching.
- Look for yellow pollen, from foraging at flowers, on hummingbirds' foreheads.
- Watch how they fan their tail at one another, dart at one another or even fly in a pendulum-style arch at one another. All are forms of physical communication.

## Keep Your Birds Cool During the Heat Wave



### Two-Tiered Lilypad Birdbath

The varied depths in this 2-tiered birdbath will make all of your birds comfortable, from the littlest chickadee to big blue jays. Durable cast aluminum with a bronze finish. Several other models of cast aluminum baths are also available.



### Butterfly Meadow Birdbath

## August Nature Happenings

- Aug. 12 - 13: Perseids Meteor shower
- Aug. 13: Full Moon, Aug 28: New Moon
- Fall raptor migration begins; watch for American Kestrels, Ospreys and Bald Eagles.
- Month of the spider - their numbers and webs peak.
- Peak month for summer wildflowers to bloom.
- Flocks of nighthawks can be seen late in the month.
- Shorebird migration builds and waterfowl migration starts.
- Monarch Butterfly migration begins.
- Early warblers (Cape May, Tennessee, Magnolia, Blackburnian) migrate through the area.
- Squirrels give birth to their second brood.
- Deer are shedding the velvet off their antlers.
- Chimney Swifts can be seen in large flocks over chimneys at dusk.
- American Goldfinches finish nesting late this month.
- Second brood of hummingbirds begin to appear at feeders early- to mid-month.
